

Class Visits – Places of Worship As a church school we place great value on teaching our pupils about faith, and the important part that religion plays in many people's lives. Both our Year 1 and Year 6 classes were able to go on trips in recent weeks - Year 1 to the Madni Mosque in Bradford, and Year 6 to Guru Nanak Nishkam Sewak Jatha in Leeds – and next week Afsha Hussein of Equilibria will be visiting our Year 2 class once again to talk about her Muslim faith. These are amazing - and important - opportunities for our children to learn first-hand about different faiths and

traditions, a key part of learning to understand and respect the diverse cultures that are part of our country. We are grateful to parents for supporting these trips, and to the hosts at the mosque and gurdwara who made us so welcome.
