

Attendance In general our school attendance is very good when compared to schools locally and nationally; last term our school attendance overall was 96.4%, compared to 93.5% across the country. As part of our responsibility for safeguarding and welfare, we check regularly to see which children have relatively low attendance, making sure we understand the reasons why this may be. We certainly don't want children coming to school when they are ill, and there are guidelines still in place for those who are sick (48 hours) or who contract Covid-19 (3 days after a positive test). However, once children's attendance falls below 90% it is likely that there will be a marked impact on their educational progress. Please let us know if you feel there is anything we can do to support you in helping to ensure your child's good attendance.
