

School Council and Global Champion Elections We are now inviting all pupils from Year 1 to Year 6 to consider putting themselves forward for one of our elected posts. School Council meet regularly with Mrs Sutton to represent the views of their classmates, and to help us to improve our provision where we can. Our Global Champions meet with Mrs Steele, and aim to promote the UN Global Goals in each classroom, making sure we talk about them and



understand what they mean, so that we can think of ways that we can make positive changes in school and in our wider community. Voting for this year's School Council will take place on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> September, with Global Champion elections on Thursday 28th September. Pupils should let their teacher know if they would like to be considered for either of these roles, although we have said that those who held an elected post last year should stand aside this year to allow others the opportunity. Sustainable journeys to school This term we are once again tracking how pupils journey to school, giving credit to those who are making at least part of at least one journey a week by sustainable means walking, scootering, cycling etc. Those who are able to do this earn a badge each month – specially designed and produced from recycled plastic – to celebrate the contribution made to reducing pollution and improving the earth's atmosphere. We recognise that for some families a journey to and from school without using the car is almost impossible, but we would still encourage you to consider 'park and stride' on a regular basis, where you park some distance from school (at least quarter of a mile) and walk the rest of the way. Older children could also arrange to meet friends and walk with them. This way we not only improve the environment, but we also reduce the congestion outside school and the inconvenience to neighbours from having cars parked on pavements and driveways. Thank you in advance for your assistance with this.

We would like to draw your attention to a 'Family Folk Day' being held **Otley Folk Festival** tomorrow (Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> September) at St Joseph's School as part of Otley Folk Festival. This will feature concert spots by some festival artists, a children's concert, displays of morris dancing, a French dance workshop and a ceilidh. The festivities run from 12.00 noon to 6.30pm, and entry is free. This is a lovely introduction to live music, and we hope you can attend to help make the event a success.
